## **CITY ATTORNEY**

City Attorney Bill Howard presented for Council's consideration an Ordinance Authorizing the Sale of Municipal Property – Surplus Property. Bechtel noted that this Ordinance authorizes the City to sell 24 more surplus properties and items, including the 1994 Spartan Fire Pumper and the Eckles building at the corner of 9th and Jordan. **FIRST READ.** 

City Attorney Howard presented for Council's consideration an Ordinance Amending Article 6 Section 6.9 Number of Liquor Licenses. This creates a Restaurant with Sunday sales liquor license for Joe's Pizza formerly Girolamo's on Jordan St. The license is for beer and wine only.
